## Press Release

Inglett & Stubbs International (ISI), an electrical contractor specializing in Power Plant Design Build Construction, Power Distribution, and Operations & Maintenance services, was awarded a Firm-Fixed-Price (FFP), Indefinite-Delivery/Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contract. The contract was issued by the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Troop Support<sup>i</sup> in direct support of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)<sup>ii</sup>. Source selection was made through full and open competition and ISI was one of five selected contractors.

This FFP, IDIQ contract is executed to provide the rapid deployment of generator sets ranging in band size from 15kW to 1MW. Generator deployment, by way of lease or rental, will be utilized to support disaster relief operations in order to protect against, respond to, recover from, or mitigate against threatened or actual major/catastrophic disasters and emergencies. This support requirement includes both natural and man-made events, which include acts of terror.

Acquisitions will occur on a task order award basis and the contract's place of performance supports efforts in the Continental United States (CONUS), Outside the Continental United States (OCOUS), and non-United States Territories or commonwealths (Caribbean and Pacific Islands). In order to properly manage this contract, ISI has created a Disaster Relief Command Center that will field work orders, interact with the end-user(s), and operate 24/7 to manage any disaster relief effort.
